

Subject: Berkeley Police Department transitioning to a 14-beat configuration

On April 1st, at the start of our new patrol timesheet, BPD will transition from a 16-beat to a 14-beat configuration. The transition to the new beat configuration is due to decreased police staffing, leading to consistently understaffed shifts. The new beat map was based on data analysis and a collaborative review by members of the Police Department, our Strategic Analysis Unit, and the Berkeley Police Association. The working group optimized beat boundaries for balanced officer workloads by considering the geography of calls for service volume, the time required of officers on scene to respond, and the resulting investigative time associated with those calls. The group prioritized neighborhood coherence in the beat map and efficient travel routes within beats. The Department is using data to increase efficiency as much as possible; however, we expect our low staffing to continue to impact service delivery, response times, and our ability to handle in-depth problem-solving.

Below is our new beat map. The beats intersecting with Berkeley Council Districts are as follows:


- District 1, Councilmember Rashi Kesarwani: Beat 2, 3, 12, 13, 14
- District 2, Councilmember Terry Taplin: Beat 3, 5, 10, 11, 12
- District 3, Councilmember Ben Bartlett: Beat 5, 6, 8, 9, 10
- District 4, Councilmember Kate Harrison: Beat 3, 4, 5, 6
- District 5, Councilmember Sophie Hahn: Beat 1, 2
- District 6, Councilmember Susan Wengraf: Beat 1
- District 7, Councilmember Rigel Robinson: Beat 6, 7, 8
- District 8, Councilmember Mark Humbert: Beat 7, 8



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The Community Services Bureau, which encompasses the Area Coordinators, Public Information Officer, and the Strategic Analysis Team, is transitioning as some officers rotate back to patrol and new officers come into the office. Officer White, Officer Hartley, and Officer McDougall are returning to patrol. Your new Area Coordinators and Public Information Officer are listed below.

This map is our Area Coordinator map. This map divides the city into four sections, assigning one Area Coordinator to each area. As beats do not match up directly with the council districts; Councilmembers will work with multiple Area Coordinators. Due to low patrol staffing, one of our new Area Coordinators, Officer Hunt, will remain in patrol until staffing allows him to transition into CSB. Eventually, Officer Hunt will be assigned to area 1. Sergeant Kleppe will be covering Area 1 until Hunt can be transferred.
